Finding Aid

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Biography of Doris C. Miller

This biographical information has been taken entirely from the Doris C. Miller Manuscript Collection at the Marshall University Archives. (ACC 525, Box 11, Series I, Subsection E, Folder 1.)

Doris C. Miller, formerly Doris Thyra Copley, was born July 18, 1903, at Shoals, Wayne County, West Virginia. She was the daughter of Mrs. Anna Luther Copley, a retired school teacher of Shoals, and the late George Washington Copley, a soldier, minister and farmer. She was descended from a number of pioneer teachers in Wayne County and was of English, Irish, Scottish, Dutch and German descent. Among her ancestral names are Baird, Craig, Stock, Luther, Harmon, Napier, Ross and James.

On October 31, 1923, Doris married John Hawes Miller of Louisa, Kentucky. He was employed by the State Road Commission and by the Forbes Construction Company of Huntington for the majority of their married life.

Doris was a graduate of Marshall University and held a Bachelor of Arts Degree in English and Social Studies (1933) and a Masters Degree in History (1943). She taught a country school in Wayne County which began on her eighteenth birthday and had since taught at high school level, served as the secretary of the minister of a large Huntington church and was employed by the Huntington Publishing Company on two separate occasions. One of these positions included working as a reporter for *The Herald Dispatch* and as a feature writer and columnist for the *Huntington Advertiser*. Her column, *Poetry Today*, appeared in the newspaper for over fifteen years. Doris C. Miller retired from the editorial staff of *The Huntington Herald Dispatch and Advertiser* in 1970.

Entering into partnership with Doris Enfield Hicks in 1951, Doris edited and then edited and published *Echoes of West Virginia*, a poetry magazine established by Miss. Hicks. It was believed to be the only strictly literary magazine the state had ever had, up until 1956, and the publication gained a worldwide audience for West Virginia poets.

As a member of the Huntington Poetry Guild since 1941 Doris generally served as its editor and, for a period, was also its president. She was also involved with many groups, clubs and organizations across Huntington and the state of West Virginia. These included, but are not limited to: Kappa Delta Pi, West Virginia Poetry Society, Huntington YWCA, Regional Authors, an honorary member of Alpha Delta Kappa, Altrusa Club of Huntington and the Big Sandy Valley Historical Society.

Doris C. Miller published two books of her own poetry as well as assisting and aiding many others in their work. These were: *Who Burnishes the Lamp*, published by Folio Press, Chicago in 1952, and *Dessert the Mirror*, the winner of the book publication contest from the Dierkes Press, Eureka Springs, Arkansas, in 1957. She also had bound a collection of cinquains

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entitles *Winged Thoughts*. However this was not formerly published and there was only one made. Aside from these books, Doris had a great many poems published in a vast range of local and national poem collections and newspapers, as well as her contribution to poetry contests and competitions. She has had verse published in *Sonnet Sequences*, *Folio*, *New Athenaeum*, *Different* and an anthology of the Dierkes Press. Doris Miller also compiled and wrote the *Centennial History of Huntington, West Virginia, 1871-1971* which was published in 1971.

Along with her membership and involvement of numerous clubs, groups and organizations, Doris Miller was also a mother of three children, John H. Miller Jr. born December 8, 1924, Lua Kathryn Miller (McDaniel) born August 12, 1926, and an adopted daughter, Mary Janice Miller (Willis). Doris also had a foster child, Joann Sparks Reitenour of Atlanta, Georgia.

Mrs. Miller's philosophy of writing and of living can be put into a few words: Prepare yourself, discipline yourself, be yourself. It is a way of life to be lived, constantly and consistency, for each thought applies to all of life, not to a given moment or period.

Doris Thyra Copley Miller died at the age of eighty-nine on Sunday, February 28, 1993, in Cabell Huntington Hospital. She is buried at the Luther-Bowen Cemetery in Shoals, West Virginia.

Scope and Content

Overview: Doris Copley Miller was a Huntington, West Virginia poet, newspaperwoman, and local historian. Papers include her work in draft and printed form and correspondence, notably the Jesse Stuart letters. It also contains poetry submissions from other friends and the public as well as working files from her years as religion, education and poetry editor at the Huntington Publishing Company. In addition to her newspaper columns, she also conducted genealogical research.

Outline of the Collection:

Doris C. Miller was a well educated woman who grew up during the First World War and bought her family up, relatively alone, during the American Depression and the Second World War. She achieved a huge amount with her life and accomplished numerous awards, certificates and acknowledgements for her active role in the town of Huntington and participation in groups and clubs in West Virginia and across the Tri-State area.

Doris was a member of over fifty groups, clubs and organizations, locally, state and nationwide. She was intimately involved in the running and organization of a large number of these. For example Doris was the president of the Huntington branch of the National League of American Pen women, editor of the poetry publication, *Echoes of West Virginia*, president of the Huntington Poetry Guild and for many years organized the Herald Dispatch Spelling Bee for school age children.

The benefit this has for the collection and its value to researchers is that due to her high position and involvement in these clubs and organizations, is that it contains a large quantity of correspondence, financial records and membership details offering information possibly unavailable from the groups themselves. The documents also offer a glimpse of the role of women within the organizations on a local and national level.

Jesse Stuart (1906-1984) was a nationally famous Appalachian poet and author. Jesse and Doris were great friends and this is obvious in the abundance of personal and professional correspondence between the two of them. Jesse used Doris's skill and talent as a professional sounding board for his many ideas for poems and regularly asked her opinions on written work. Thus the letters and information held in the collection is of obvious importance to anyone researching poetry, Appalachian authors and poets and more specifically, Jesse Stuart himself. He was not the only poet and author that requested Doris's help. The collection contains over three boxes of transcripts, manuscripts, prose, verse and poetry that striving authors wanted Doris to look at and critique.

As well as her work on poetry, the clubs and organizations and the newspaper, Doris was very interested in researching genealogy, both for her newspaper column 'Tree Searching' and for personal family and friends. The information available in the genealogical subsection of this collection holds invaluable and extensive information for local genealogical researchers.

Doris was maintaining her involvement with all these groups whilst working numerous jobs, bringing up her children and supporting her family, and thus the collection paints a good picture of the social history for women, particularly within West Virginia and the 'Tri-State' area in the twentieth century. The volume of personal correspondence, her family papers and a lot of her professional papers all contribute to this research.

Organization of the Collection:

The Doris C. Miller Papers came to Marshal University Archives following the death of Mrs. Doris Copley Miller. They were in a disorganized and random state. Therefore there was minimal 'original order' within the collection. This made sorting and organizing it a more complex process. It was important to maintain any original filing within the jumble of paperwork whilst 'imposing' an organizational system on the papers. There were a number of small files, for example there was a few in the 'Genealogy' section and one in the 'Jesse Stuart Papers' where Mrs. Miller had filed paperwork under certain names. These files have been left as they were found and placed within the section that is most

fitting for their contents. Due to this, some of the information in these files may appear to be out of place, out of chronological order and may not entirely appear to 'fit' its position within the collection.

The main series titles of the collection have been selected for their broad nature. Within these larger brackets there are subsections which are slightly more specific and concise as to the contents. There is, on occasion, further specification at the subsection level of the enclosed documents and then each folder has its own informational title and contents note.

'Unprocessed' boxes contain information that has yet to be sorted into the main subsections of the collection. For the most part they have been separated into the series they belong to but have received no preservation or further processing. This is not to say that there is not a wealth of information available within these boxes. They will eventually be incorporated into the main sections of the collection. The 'Unidentified' boxes have no obvious or defined places within the collection but have undergone some preservation and processing.
