## WIFE OF JUDGE CALDWELL DIES

Paralytic Stroke Proves Fatal;

Funeral Tuesday

Funeral services for Mrs. Beulah Rich Caldwell, 52, wife of Judge A. M. Caldwell, of Campbell County Circuit Court, who died Sunday at her home, 452 Ward-av, Bellevue, will be held Tuesday at the residence, with services at 2:30 p. m. at the Bellevue Christian Church. Burial will be in Highland Cemetery.

Mrs. Caldwell died as the result of a paralytic stroke suffered late Friday after she and Judge Caldwell had returned home from a motor trip thru Kentucky.

Mrs. Caldwell was born at Piner, Ky. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Wallace Rich, pioneer residents of Kenton-co.

Besides her husband, she is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Bertha Gabriel, Piner, and a son, Alfred R. Caldwell, student at the University of Kentucky, who is convalescing from an appendicitis operation he underwent Friday at Lexington.

The body of Mrs. Caldwell will be placed in a vault at the Highland Cemetery until the son recovers. Services at the church Tuesday will be conducted by Rev. H. C. Runyan, pastor of the Latonia Christian Church.

A. C. Dobbins & Son, Bellevue, are in charge of the funeral.

A special meeting of the Campbell-co Bar Association was held Monday to take action on the death of Mrs. Caldwell. The following honorary pallbearers were appointed: C. W. Yungblut, Matt Herold, Fred B. Bassman, Lawrence J. Diskin, John W. Heuver, L. W. Scott and William U. Warren.

The Resolution Committee, composed of Aubrey Barbour, James B. Milliken, Oscar Forster and Martin Kirchhoff, drafted a resolution on the death of Mrs. Caldwell.

Judge Caldwell received his preliminary education under the late Henry Lambert of Cabell County. About 1892, he attended the old Holbrook School at Lebanon Ohio, run by the Holbrookes. He had previously attended Marshall College. Later, he attended the University of Louisville Law School, from which institution, he graduated in 1898.

Previous to coming to Kentucky, he taught school in Cabell County, W. Va. He was elected City Attorney of Bellevue and served from 1906 to 1908.

His wife, Beulah Rich Caldwell of Piner Kentucky, died Sept. 25, 1932. The funerals were conducted on the same day. Both <sup>(all)</sup> were buried in Highland Cemetery, at Fort Mitchell, near Covington, Kentucky

Judge Caldwell was a staunch Republican, yet was repeatedly elected to public office from a district which was overwhelmingly democratic.

This speaks volumes for his popularity, and throws much light on his personality.

He was a peace maker. On many occasions, while sitting on the bench, during many an angry controversy, he calmed his hearers by saying, "now, folks, let's be brothers."

He was an optimist and made optimists wherever he was found. He had his share of this world's troubles, and his heart showed an unbounded sympathy for his fellow-travellers on life's road.

Andrew Jordon, of Milton, Recalls old Politics as He  
pares for Eighty-Sixth Birthday -

- - - - -

-Many Descendants Will Attend in Celebration-  
Seven Sons and Sixty Grandchildren to be Present.

-----

When Andrew Jordan, of Milton, one of Cabell County's oldest native-born, celebrates his 86th birthday August 20th, seven sons and 60 grandchildren and great grandchildren will be on hand to extend him felicitations.

Mr. Jordan, long identified with Republican politics, with the exception of six years residence in Mason County, has always resided in Cabell County. He cast his first vote, in 1868. In this year he voted the Democratic ticket; but the following Presidential election found him with the Republican party in sympathy, although he did not have the opportunity to exercise his franchise.

It was in the campaign that Abraham Lincoln defeated Stephen A. Douglass that that Mr. Jordan cast his vote. He said yesterday he long has regretted it, and frequently has wished that he had stood with the candidate who was to go down in history as one of the country's greatest Presidents.

When the American populace turned to support "Honest Abe" for his re-election, Mr. Jordan expected to add his vote to the number. Election day, however, found him seven miles from the polls, and no horse to carry him in.

"Why did you vote for Douglass?" the Herald-Dispatch reporter asked Mr. Jordan.

"My family were Democrats," he replied, "and, as I was only 22 years old, I accepted their opinions without investigating very much for myself."

"Why did you change your politics at the next Presidential election," the reported wanted to know.

"The Democrats were for secession," he said, "and I was for the Union." And the veteran Miltonian has been loyal to the party ever since.

"I believe," asserted Mr. Jordan, "that politics were much cleaner tinnthosae days than now. I remember, in particular, one time when the nominee for Sheriff was being elected. Instead of the secret balloting that we now have, the five men who had announced themselves candidates for the office, met on the street corner. Practically the entire County had assembled in town that day. As each candidate stood on the platform, the men who were voting for him stepped to one side, and were counted. After all candidates had stood up, the one who had had the largest number of men stand aside for him, was elected nominee."

Mr. Jordan lived forty years on Lower Creek, and was the oldest pioneer present at the recent County Life Conference held there by the Cabell County Farm Bureau.

Mr. Jordan is a Baptist, very strong for prohibition, and equally strong against evolution.

The birthday celebration August 30 is to take the form of a home coming for all of his relatives.

## THE FIFE FAMILY.

My (G.A.Fife's) grandfather and grandmother Fife was from Dublin, Ireland. My father John K. Fife, was born on the ocean, eight days before they landed in America. They settled near Sweet Springs, Va., in 1776, and in 1791, my father came to Point Pleasant, W.Va. He framed the Court House in Point Pleasant, W. Va. It was the only one at that time west of the Allegheny Mountains. During his stay there he joined with a party of pioneers to form a settlement near the mouth of George's Creek Gallia County, Ohio. The party was composed of Edward and Samuel Logue, Samuel Entsminger, John K. Fife, my father, and one negro man, Dick Servant. They remained there several years under the protection of the garrison and skirmished with the Indians (the remainder of Cornstalk's tribe) on several occasions.

My grandfather and grandmother Rupe settled in Cheshire Township, on the farm where John H. Bing know lives. They came from Shenandoah County, Georgia in 1794. I have often heard my mother say her father built his cabin high from the ground and penned his sheep under the house to keep the wolves from them. The fever and ague was so bad they soon moved to Huntington Township, Gallia County, O., on the waters of Little Raccoon Creek.

On December 7, 1810 John K. Fife, my father and Catherine Rupe, my mother, were married by Abel Larkin, Justice of the Peace, and settled where the town of Ewington is now located, in Gallia County, Ohio. To this union the following children were born: Abraham, Matthew, Sargent, Mary, Malinda and George A.

Abraham married (Evaline Mayne) Emily Mayes April 14, 1842 by L.D. Vanzandt, Justice of the Peace and located in Middleport Ohio. To this union the following four children were born:



Clarissa Minerva, Mathias, William and Jabez. Clarissa married Joshua Vance, Aug. 22 1862 in Jackson County Ohio. Both ran away from home in Middleport, O., went to Portsmouth and then to Jackson, where they were married. They were the parents of the following children: Florence Leola, Erma, Joe, Nannie, Edward all living at present and Frank and Carrie deceased. Mathias never married. He spent the latter part of his life with his sister, Clarissa at her home in Kanauga. William married and had one daughter, Edna. Jabez was injured while playing with a weapon left at their home by a Civil War soldier and died from the effects at the age of 14 years.

Sargent, married and lived near Crown City Ohio, and in West Virginia. *This was Abel S. Fife of Nine Mile Creek.*

Matthew married and moved to Chillicothe, Ohio. He had one son, Tom. Little is known of his life.

Mary, married a McCrobie and movee to Missouri. They had three sons, George, Nathan and Edward.

Malinda, married a Crawford and later a Rainey. They lived in West Virginia.

I, George Adam Fife, was born on August 1, 1822. In 1836 we moved to Cheshire Township, and settled on the waters of Little Kyger Creek, near where William Shuler now lives.

Isaac Rowley was born in Massachusetts and came to Cheshire Township, in 1815.

Rachel Lemley was born in Pennsylvania, and came to Cheshire Township, about 1818.

On May 18, 1823, Isaac Rowley and Rachel Lemley was married by William Slaughter, Justice of the Peace of Morgan Township. On October 15, 1826, a daughter, Margaret Freelove Rowley was born.

On the 27th day of June 1843, I, George Adam Fife and Margaret Freelove Rowley was married by the Reverend R.H. Hibert, ordained Minister of the Jeruselum Church. To this union the following children were born: Joseph, Rachel, William W., Mary Jane, George W., Sarah Catherine, Margaret E., Elmyra, and John F.

Here let me state that I first started as a sawyer, and then went to building flat boats. Later I entered into the carpenter trade and joiners business. I worked at this business 34 years, and in that time have had 27 apprentices working for me. On August 7, 1861 I enlisted in Company I, 4th West Virginia Volunteer Infantry and served 3 years, 3 months and 3 days, receiving an honorable discharge.

On October 27, 1876 he married Phoebe Ralph with Wm. S. Jenkins, J.P. officiating. To this union the following children were born: Jennie, Dell, Francis, Walter, Curtis Margaret and Savannah. He died September 7, 1923 and in the following year she passed away.

Rachel Ellen was born May 2, 1847. She was married to Reuben Thomas on June 20, 1866 by Wm.S.Jenkins, J.P. To this union the following children were born: Harvey, Arthur, Molly, Maud, Warren and May.

William W. was born January 19, 1849, and died October 13, 1861.

Mary Janes was born December 5, 1851. She was married by R.J.Poston, Clergyman, to Peery Ralph, December 24, 1868. They became the parents of the following children: Cora, Dallas, Andrew and Edward.

Sarah Catherine was born April 2, 1857. She was married to A. H. Graham June 12, 1875 by Alexander Logue, J.P. Mr.Graham passed away rather early in life. On March 21, 1894, Sarah Catherine and Joseph Ball, Shenandoah Valley Va. were united in marriage by William Tate, J.P. He died in March 1920.

Margaret E. was born December 5, 1857. She was married to Fostus Swisher November 29, 1878, by Wm.S.Jenkins, J.P. Both are living and reside at Youngstown Ohio. They became the parents of the following children: Edna, Earl, Maude, Alice, Fred, Mayno and Atwood.

Elmira was born August 11, 1859. She died in infancy.

John F. was born May 15, 1861. On June 15, 1861, he was married to Mariah Howley by Wm. S. Jenkins, J.P. He died in 1934. She is still living and resides at Cheshire, Ohio. To this union the following children were born: Ross, Esther, Erma, George Adam and Earl. Earl died early in life at the age of 23 years.

George W. was born May 1, 1853. He was married to Mary Ann Thomas April 29, 1873 by C.W.Bird, Mayor of the City of Gallipolis, Ohio. He died in February, 1933, and she in May, 1931. To

LeSage, was also awarded death pension.

I have received your letter of 21 July 1952 requesting the record of Francis J. LeSage who served during the Civil War.

The records show that Francis J. LeSage, aged 26 years, was enrolled 29 September 1862 at Guyandotte, Virginia, was mustered into service 13 December 1862 at Ceredo, Virginia as an ordnance sergeant, Captain Witcher's Company, 3d Regiment Virginia Cavalry, which subsequently became Company G, 3d Regiment West Virginia Cavalry; was promoted to 2nd Lieutenant 9 August 1863; was promoted to Captain and transferred to Company L, same regiment 30 April 1865 and was honorably discharged as a Captain 30 June 1865 at Wheeling, West Virginia.

The Civil War records on file in this office are of a strictly military character rarely showing items of personal history.

It is possible that some information concerning the dates of his birth and death can be obtained from the pension records which are in the custody of the Archivist of the United States Washington 25, D. C., therefore, your letter has been referred to that official for consideration.

The records show that Julius C. LeSage enlisted 24 July 1885 at San Diego Barracks, California, and was honorably discharged as a Sergeant, Company D, 8th Regiment of Infantry, 23 July 1890 at Fort Robinson, Nebraska.

He again enlisted 19 September 1893 at Cincinnati, Ohio, and was honorably discharged as a Sergeant, Company B, 5th Regiment of Infantry, 18 September 1898 at Santiago, Cuba.

He reenlisted 19 September 1898 at Santiago, Cuba, and was honorably discharged as a Sergeant, Company B, 5th Regiment of Infantry, 5 May 1899 at Dos Cominos, Cuba.

He reenlisted 8 May 1899 at Santiago, Cuba, and was honorably discharged as a 1st Sergeant, Company B, 5th Regiment of Infantry, 7 May 1902 at Lingayen, Philippine Islands.

He reenlisted 8 May 1902 at Lingayen, Philippine Islands, and was honorably discharged as a Sergeant, Company E, 7th Regiment of Infantry, 15 December 1904 at Cuartel de Espana, Manila, Philippine Islands, to accept a commission in the Philippine Scouts. He accepted a commission as 2nd Lieutenant, Philippine Scouts, 16 December 1904; 1st Lieutenant 19 September 1908, and resigned his commission 1 May 1911.

He came to the United States, in the 1830's, to Boston, Massachusetts. He returned to France, and later, came to Ann Street, in New York where he manufactured hat and banded boxes.

He returned to France, from New York, and then came to Philadelphia, and on to Pittsburg. While there, he met William Jenkins who had brought a flat boat loaded with corn and produce. Mr. LeSage came down the river with him, on a steamboat. This boat broke down, at Haskelville, now Athalia, and Mr. Jenkins advised him.

Michael Lesage born in Paris, France. He married Sophia Howell. Both were born and raised, in that city.

One of their sons was Jules F. M. Lesage (Jules Francis Magdalen). He was born, in 1811, in Paris, and was a soldier, in the French campaign, in Algeria, in North Africa. He early came to ~~New York~~, Philadelphia, and later went to New York, where he became a hat manufacturer, and made band boxes. In 1857, he came to Cabell County, purchased land of James Knight, and settled on it near Lesage. Here he lived and died. In politics, he was a whig, and a Republican. During the Civil War, he served in the Union army. In New York his hat and band box manufactory was on Ann Street. He was elected by the Icarian Society to go to Nauvoo, Illinois, to take charge of that colony, after

the Normans left for the west. He came down the Ohio river on a boat from Pittsburg. When they reached a point between Muller Ohio, and Haskelville, <sup>now Aithalia,</sup> the shaft of the wheel broke, and they had to land. There they were delayed for about two weeks. While there they met James Knight ~~of~~ who lived <sup>in West Va.</sup> opposite Aithalia, and on January 2, 1852, he and his wife Anna Knight sold him some land. Other members of the colony went on to Nauvoo, but he remained. He had been a royalist in the Revolution, but when Napoleon III lost his throne, he fled France and came to America.
