- SOME HISTORY OF JOHN PLYMALE AND HIS DESCENDANTS -

Editor of the Wayne News:

We usually think of History as a recital of the deeds of great leaders, military or civil, such as governors, senators, Presidents, or great discoverers, inventors, &c. If we can't be one of them, we like to run our family tree back to one of them. We fail to recognize the fact that in all such adventures, the common man was just as necessary as the leaders. This was most certainly true of our pioneer settlers, for it was they who cleared the forests, built their log cabins, and laid the foundations for our present civilization.

The accompanying will of John Plymale gives us an introduction to one of the very early pioneers families of Wayne, then a part of Cabell County. He was not the earliest settler here, as many had preceeded him by fifteen or twenty years; but he came in time to find a howling wilderness in the Twelve Pole Valley. His neighbors were few, and widely scattered. He was born November 25, 1795, in Botetourt County, Virginia, and came here ^{from Giles County,} in the spring of 1815. He was then a mere boy of about twenty years of age. We do not know why he left home and probably never will know. No doubt, he was restless, like other youths of those days, and sought adventure beyond the mountains, where land was cheap, and game plentiful. Little is known of his forbears in Virginia.

Tradition says he was one of seven brothers, and that his father was Anthony Plymale, and his mother a Bowen, possibly a distant relative of Hugh Bowen, the first of the Bowens to come to Wayne.

John Plymale and his brothers, Anthony and Gabriel, are shown by records to have been the only Plymales who settled in Wayne County. William Plymale remained in Virginia, and Bowen Plymale probably came here, as he was said to be rather profligate. If he did come here, he must have gone elsewhere, probably west, for he never owned any land in Wayne County.

James Plymale married Polly Hatfield, October 6, 1828, the daughter of James Hatfield, of Lincoln County, and purchased land on Guyandotte River below Barboursville, but evidently went further west.

Hugh Plymale, another brother, settled at Yellowtown, below Gallipolis, Ohio. He raised a large family, but died of yellow fever in 1878, having contracted the dreadful disease from the towboat, John Porter, which came up from the south, in that year. Every man on board died, and the boat drifted to the shore at the Plymale farm. ~~James Plymale went west, and Gabriel sold his farm to Henry Luther for \$100.00.~~ *sold out to Henry Luther for \$100* James Plymale went west, and Gabriel was last heard from in Kansas. All of these Plymales came direct from Giles county, Virginia, indicating that the family had left Botetourt County and removed farther south.

John soon sent for his brother, Anthony; and the two of them married Ferguson sisters, and lived, reared their large families, and died on the waters of Twelve Pole, about Buffalo Creek. John built his small, log cabin on the north bank of Twelve Pole, a short distance above the mouth of Buffalo Creek. Anthony built his cabin on the opposite side of the creek. After a number of years John built a fine, brick home, which is still standing and is owned by a Mr. Miller. There were several such buildings in the neighborhood, all of which were built by a Mr. Stuck, an old brick mason.

As stated, John and Anthony Plymale married sisters. John

married Rebecca Ferguson, December 23, 1819; and Anthony married Polly Ferguson, June 10, 1824. Rebecca died July 29, 1828, aged 27 years and nine months. She left five children, as follows:

1. Anthony Wayne Plymale was born June 10, 1823, at Buffalo Shoals. He was married twice and had two sets of children. His first wife was Permelia Chadwick, daughter of Hiram Chadwick. They were married Oct. 9, 1845. She was born July 22, 1826. They had eight children:

1. Rebecca Plymale, born Nov. 5, 1847; married Anthony Wayne Plymale Jan. 3, 1844. He was a son of Anthony Plymale. Sr. They had nine children.

2. Frances (Leah F.) Plymale, born May 12, 1849. Married James Spears. They lived in Missouri, and had six or eight children: James Spears, Hadley Spears, and others.

3. Lucretia Plymale was born Dec. 5, 1851, and lived to be quite old. She married Luke Drown, son of Benjamin Drown by his first wife. They had several children.

4. John Milton Plymale, born Nov. 24, 1853, and died November, 1925. He married Anna Merrill, of Ironton, Ohio. They had four children:

Sadie, married a Mr. Hawks. She lives in Kenova.

Curtis Plymale, Kenova, W. Va.

Harry, lives in Cincinnati. I have not learned

the name of the fourth one - but believe it was Grace Plymale.

This family lived on Walker's Branch, in Wayne county. They had a daughter, Permelia Plymale who married Sheridan, son of Alderson Plymale, and grandson of Anthony Plymale, Sr. Her second husband was Oscar Frizzell. They had a son, Claude Frizzell, who died at 16 or 18 years of age. She then married James Hensley, and had three more children.

7. Josephine Plymale

B. Feb.17, 1859. Married Dr. John Grant, son of William and Bethia Plymale Grant. They lived at Buffalo Shoals.

8. Albert Gallatin Plymale, known as "Gallie"

B. Nov.13, 1861.

Married Daisy Myers of Moundsville, Dec.2, 1889.

They had two sons and two daughters.

Married, second Mrs. Malinda Johnson Forbess July 27 1867. She was a widow of James Forbess. She had two sons. ~~They were~~ killed in the Union army.

James Forbess married a Carroll, went west, and died ~~ed~~ probably in Nebraska. They had five daughters, one of whom, Mary Forbess, died at about six years of age. Children of Anthony Wayne Plymale:

He married Signey Dixon June 7, 1893, daughter of George and Ann Perdue Dixon, of Dock's Creek, who was a daughter of Melvena Perdue (Jim?). They lived on Buffalo, about one mile, up.

2. Edward Plymale.

Born Sept.13, 1869.

Married Leah Malcolm Sept. 29,1901. She was born Jan.31, 1879. Eight children, five girls and three boys. They live one mile up Buffalo Creek.

3. Lindsey Plymale,

Born April 8, 1871.

Married Minnie Stalls, of Muncie, Indiana. They lived for some time at Muncie, but moved to Cleveland, Ohio, and died there. They had two daughters and four sons.

4. Cora Grace Plymale

Born Sept.22, 1873. (*Haynie*)

Married Antjony ~~Haynie~~ *Haynie*. He died in March 1949. He was the son of William *Haynie* (sometimes spelled ~~Haynie~~ *Haney*) who had married Elizabeth Plymale, daughter of Anthony Plymale, Sr. by his first wife. Mrs. Cora Grace ~~Haney~~ *Haynie* is still living--about two or three hundred yards up Buffalo Creek.

She had two daughters and five sons. All are living but one.

5. Bethia Plymale was born July 19,1875, and attended the common schools at Wayne county. In 1910, she graduated in the Normal Department of Marshall College, and taught for three years in the Wayne county schools. She received her A.B.degree from -5-

Illinois University in 1918; then taught three years in Gauley County, and three years at Ronceverte. She received her Master's degree at Columbia, in 1923. In 1924 she became a

teacher in Ashville College, Ashville, North Carolina, and remained there until 1941, when she retired. She is now living in Huntington with her sister, Mrs. William McQuinn.

6. Dollie Blanche Plymale.

Born Aug. 3, 1877.
Married Thomas McQuinn, brother of William McQuinn. They live near Newark, Ohio.

7. Lillie Plymale

Born July 14, 1880. ~~She and Lillie were twin~~

8. ~~Lelia Plymale. She married William McQuinn, and lives~~

sisters. She married William McQuinn, and lives in Huntington.

11. Rebecca Plymale, born Oct. 20, 1826; died Feb. 24, 1892, daughter of John and Rebecca (Ferguson) Plymale. Married John Bromley. They lived at Louisa, Kentucky. They had a son, John Plymale Bromley, who first married Josephine Vinson, sister of Mrs. Belle Vinson Hughes. Josephine Vinson Bromley had two children:

Charles Vinson Bromley, who lives in Kenova; and Ella Yates Bromley, who married John Mullins, and had, among other children, Miss Mary Blair Mullins, of Huntington.

Altogether, Rebecca Plymale Bromley and her husband had twelve children, two of whom died in infancy. I regret that I can't give them all in this

article, but among the others were:

Sam Bromley, who married Belle Walker. They lived in Louisa. A son, John Bromley, lives in Huntington.

Anthony Wayne Bromley is a practicing physician in Louisa, Kentucky, and is the only one of the family living.

There were six daughters in the John Bromley family, all of whom married, and most of them had families.

I may later give a more complete account of the Bromleys.

III. Bethia Plymale, daughter of John and Rebecca Ferguson Plymale, married William Grant. They lived at Webster Ohio. They had several children, among whom were Dr. John Grant, who first married Josephine Plymale daughter of Anthony Wayne Plymale and his first wife Permela Chadwick Plymale. They lived at Buffalo Shoals, where he practiced medicine. They had three children:

Clyde Grant, ~~who died when a young man~~

Adrian Grant, who died when a young man,

Io Grant married, and had two or three children. She is dead.

Dr. John Grant

Married, second, Nannie Artrip. They lived at Buffalo Shoals, and had three or four children. The family moved to Webster, O., where Dr. Grant died. But Mrs. Grant is living there yet.

IV. Josephine Plymale, daughter of John and Rebecca Ferguson Plymale, married Joseph Blaine Malcolm. She was born Nov. 5, 1824, and died Nov. 10, 1871. Mr. Malcolm was born March 24, 1810, and died March 24, 1876. They were married April 21, 1842, on the first marriage license issued after Wayne County was formed. They had two sons and three daughters:

1. John Plymale Malcolm,

Born May 28, 1843. Died May 27, 1916. He married Rebecca Plymale, born December 11, 1841, and died Jan. 19, 1907. She was a daughter of Anthony and Polly Ferguson Plymale. They married in February, 1864, and had ten children.

2. Joseph Malcolm

Born June 14, 1845; died February 11, 1917. Married Sophia Sprecher, daughter of a Dutch woman who came directly from Holland with about eight children. She gave them away. Sophia was given to Joseph McCormack, of Huntington. They had eight children.

3. Rebecca Jo~~g~~ Malcolm: Born Sept. 30, 1847; died Nov. 12, 1877. Married William Maloney (She is buried in Dock's Creek cemetery). They had four children. The mother, and her last child died at the same time.

4. Caswell Carlisle Malcolm, born June 8, 1851. I was unable to obtain the date of her death. She married Loma Arnold, of Missouri. They had

had ten children. He died at Edgerton, Missouri.

V. Clarinda Plymale

These are all the children of John and Rebecca Ferguson Plymale, but there is no certainty of the order in which they should be given, as the dates of their births is not known to this writer.

A few years after the death of his first wife, John Plymale, on Sept. 1, 1833, married Louanna Shelton, born in Wayne County, Nov. 27, 1811. She was a daughter of John and Sarah Shelton, and a grand daughter of General Elisha McComas, who lived near what is now Salt Rock, Cabell County. General McComas was the best known and most influential of all the McComases who came to this section. His father, John McComas, was a Revolutionary soldier. There were fourteen children in this family, the exact order of births being uncertain. They were:

III. Virginia Plymale, married William Ferguson, son of James and Mary Ferguson, and brother of Charles W. Ferguson, Sr. and others. They lived on the Left Fork of Twelve Pole, about one and one-half miles from Wayne. Their children were: Wayne, James, John, William and Rebecca, who married Lawrence Dickerson, a former County Superintendent of schools. He died at about ninety years old.

IV. John Plymale, born about 1838, married Sally Moore. They lived between the Shoals of Twelve Pole and Buffalo Creek. Several of their children died in infancy. Ed and Marion Plymale are dead.

V. Ann Plymale

Married James Ferguson, brother to William Ferguson.

They had about four daughters and one son.

VI. ^{Sally F.} ~~George F.~~ Plymale, born December 18, 1840, and died at about 72 years old. Aug. 13, 1868 he married Martha Priscilla McKeand, born in Wayne County Jan. 11, 1848, daughter of James Thomas McKeand, born Sept. 1, 1815, and Julia Ann Kilgore McKeand, born in Cabell county Sept. 27, 1821; and died March 27, 1865. Their children were:

1. Sidney Grant Plymale,

Born Aug. 8, 1869. He married Myrtle Green, of Muncie, Indiana. They had about five children, two of whom were sons. She now lives at Grafton, W. Va.

2. MARY Elizabeth Plymale was born Jan. 15, 1871. She married twice:

1. To Noah Artrip, a school teacher,

2. To Will Litteral, who came from ~~at~~ or near Greenup, Ky. She is dead.

3. Columbia Annie Plymale, Born Sept. ~~24~~²⁷, 1872. She married John Kilgore, of near Milton, W. Va. A son, Thos. W. Kilgore is a Cashier in the First National Bank, of Huntington.
4. James McKeand Plymale
 Born July 29, 1874. ~~She~~^{He} married Franky Myers of Muncie, Indiana. A son, Harry Plymale, may be living
5. Lourana Plymale, born August 27, 1876. Died in infancy.
6. St. Luke Plymale, (kndwn as Luke) was born July 27, 1878. He married Velma Airhart, of Muncie, Indiana. They had two children: Guy Plymale, Muncie, Indiana; Gladys Plymale, who married Llloyd Rowe, son of Uriah Rowe, of Buffalo Creek.
7. Guy Plymale, Jr. born April 21, 1880. He married Anna Vickers. They live on Buffalo Creek, about a half mile from the school. They have four sons and one daughter.
8. Samuel Sperry Vinson ~~Reynolds~~^{Plymale}, born Sept. 21, 1883. He married Carrie Johnson, daughter of Harrison and Mahala Ballengee Johnson. He is now Circuit Clerk of Wayne county. They were parents of three children:

- VII. Octavian Plymale, born Nov. 15, 1842; died June 25, 1920. He married Marietta Perdue, daughter of Sylvester Perdue, a descendant of Isaiah Perdue, who died in 1819. Marietta Perdue was born, Feb. 19, 1851, and died April 17, 1938 (Easter Sunday) Their children were: Belle Plymale, born March 29, 1872; Harvey Plymale, born August 21, 1874. Sylvester ~~Perdue~~^{Plymale}, born April 15, 1876; died Jan. 27, 1939.

William Plymale, born June 11, 1880.

Ada Plymale, born July 28, 1882.

John M.M. Plymale, the oldest member of this family, was born April 2, 1870. Much of his lifetime, he following teaching school. He holds a life certificate, but is now retired, being 80 years old. Mr. Plymale is by all odds, the best single authority on the Plymale family, and is well informed on many of the pioneer families of Wayne County, and their early customs. He taught the Davis Creek, Watson, and Pea Ridge schools of Cabell County, the Westmoreland Graded School, the Buffalo High School when it was a third class school; the Haynie's Branch school and other Wayne county schools. Mr. Plymale married Myrtle Belle Warnock, daughter of Taylor and Catherine Warnock, of Greenup and Carter Counties, Kentucky.

Mr. and Mrs. Plymale were the parents of ten children, the oldest, Lena Plymale born Dec. 10, 1895; and the youngest, Louise Plymale, born Jan. 18, 1916. His son, Clarence Plymale, born Aug. 17, 1908, is a physician in Huntington.

VIII. Marion Plymale, son of John and Lourana Plymale, married Mary Burge. They lived on Twelve Pole, and had ^{five} four children--two sons and three daughters. All are dead. Mary Burge was a daughter of a Confederate soldier. They had at least five children:

Alma Plymale, died in infancy.

Myrtle Plymale, married William Neff. They lived in the Plymale settlement.

Leonard Plymale

Married Mrs. Lillian _____, widow of a Doctor. He was wealthy. Mr. and Mrs. Plymale lived at Bakersfield, Cal.

Grover C. Plymale married

Mary Johnson, of Kentucky. They lived on Plymale Branch.

Ruth Plymale, died single

about three or four years ago.

IX. Indiana Plymale, daughter of John and Lourana Plymale married William Billups. They lived at Fort Gay, and had a son, John Billups, who died recently, at eighty-six years old. William Billups was a son of Richard Allen and Hulda Moore Billups. In addition to John Billups, there were five other sons in this family, among whom were Jim, Sam, and William Billups.

X. Hugh Plymale,

Married Druzilla Drown, known as "Aunt Dood" She was a daughter of Benjamin Drown, by his second wife. They were the parents of twelve children, one of whom, Welleasley Plymale, is an employee of the Veteran's Hospital.

XI. Sarah Plymale, daughter of John and Lourana Shelton, married Sinclair Roberts. He was born October 23, 1849, and died July 2, 1912. She was known as "Aunt Sack" They had three daughters:

Florence married Sam Dock Smith, son of Rebel Bill Smith; Mollie married Dr. Richard Hardwick. Hattie died in infancy.

XII. Millard Plymale married Eliza McComas, daughter of James McComas, who lived on Plymale Branch. They had two children, ^{Lourana} Lourana and Howard Plymale.

XIII. Polly Plymale married Robert Roberts. They lived on Bolt's Fork, back of Catlettsburg, Kentucky, and had about seven children.

XIV. Jefferson D. Plymale

Married first, Lina Wilcox, whose father was Jim Wilcox. They had a son, Eugene Plymale, who lived on Plymale Branch. Jeff married second, Nettie Hensley, ^{She} died Oct. 16, 1944, at 74 years and 19 days. She was a daughter of Alex. and Mary Fry Hensley.

Many more interesting things might be written about the Plymale family; but lack of space compels us to close.

Damron Family

Lazarus Damron came to Wayne County, ^{then Cabell} Virginia with his wife Elizabeth Short Damron in 1825. They had been married, likely in the 1780's in Russell Co. Va. leaving there for eastern Kentucky, where they lived until coming to Wayne Co. This information is found in Sam'l Damron's biography in Hardesty History, Wayne County section.

Elizabeth Short Damron was the daughter of Samuel Short and his wife Mary McKentley. She ^{Elij. Short} had brothers, Sam'l and Thomas, and sisters, Susannah, wife of David Webb, and Mary, wife of William Bromley. Lazarus Damron died in 1829 and Elizabeth in 1827.

Information is available about four of the sons of Lazarus and Elij. Short Damron: Moses born in 1790, Samuel 1793, Richard in 1796 and George in 1808.

Moses married first in 1811 in Floyd County, Ky, Polly Preston. Their children were 1. Samuel (1812-1906) who married first Vashti Jarrell, sister of Rev. John Jarrell.

The children of Samuel and "Vashti" were:
