Biographical Sketch:

Memphis Tennessee Garrison was born in Hollins, VA on March 4, 1890. She moved to Gary, WV with her parents Cassie and Wesley Carter. Wesley Carter was a contractor for the coal mines but was killed by a train when Garrison was a young child. Her mother worked as a housekeeper. Garrison attended high school in Ohio and began teaching in McDowell County, WV in 1908. She obtained a B.S. at Bluefield State College in 1939 and pursued advanced courses at Ohio University. Garrison taught for over 35 years and continued to serve as a substitute teacher for many years. She was a member of several teachers' associations. She served as the first female President of the West Virginia State Teacher's Association from 1929-1930. In 1931, she served as vice president of the American Teacher's Association. She also served as secretary/treasurer of the Bluefield State Alumni Association.

Garrison associated herself with the Republication party until the John F. Kennedy era. She had always been a civil rights activist. She worked as a welfare worker for U.S. from 1931 until 1946 when the workers were unionized. Garrison became aware of the NAACP in 1918 when she read a copy of the *Crisis*. In 1921, she started an NAACP branch in Gary, WV making it the third in the state. She was appointed secretary and she was the treasurer of the state-wide chapter from 1945-1966. She attended over thirty NAACP conferences. One of her most notable accomplishments was the Christmas Seal Project that she began in 1927. She designed and sold the seals as a source of fundraising and sold more seals than anyone in the nation. She served as the national field secretary in the 1950s and was vice-president of the National Board from 1963-1966. She received many awards from the NAACP including the Walker medal for distinguished

service to Negroes in 1920 and the T. G Nutter award in 1959. She was a member of the Human Rights Commission from 1964-1966. In 1969, she received an honorary degree of Doctor of Humanities from Marshall University. She moved to Huntington, WV and lived there until her death in 1988.

Scope and Content:

This collection contains the personal, religious, educational, and political possessions of Memphis Tennessee Garrison. The collection includes correspondence, photographs, newspaper articles, programs, books, financial documents, publications, newsletters, plaques, certificates, a diary, and a jewelry box. The materials document Garrison's various roles on the local and national levels of the NAACP as well as her participation in other civil rights activities.
