BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION

Mary Lois Garrett, born on January 3, 1908, was from Kenova, WV, and taught in the Wayne County School system for 39 years. She was also a first lieutenant in the medical corps of the U.S. Navy WAVES and served during World War II.¹ She was an avid bird-watcher with a specific interest in Indigo Buntings, and was a charter member of the Huntington Audubon Society. Ms. Garrett observed the Indigo Bunting over the course of the years 1950-1954, in Huntington, WV and on South Bass Island on Lake Erie in Ohio. Her interest in birds led her to attend the September 1950 meeting of the Wilson Ornithological Club, sponsored by the Brooks Bird Club and the Huntington Bird Study Club, held at the 4-H Camp in Jackson's Mill, WV.² In 1957, she was listed on the Auditing Committee of the Wilson Ornithological Club, and in 1960, she attended the Conservation Education Workshop held at West Virginia University on August 8-23.³ Ms. Garrett was listed as an observer in the 1966 "Bird Breeding Survey" produced by the U.S. Department of the Interior in conjunction with the Fish and Wildlife Service.⁴ She occasionally collaborated in her work with Dr. Ralph M. Edeburn in the Department of Zoology at Marshall College. Mary Lois Garrett died on September 3, 1991 at the age of 83.⁵

SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE COLLECTION

This collection spans the years 1941-1954, with the bulk of the research covering the years 1950-1954. File contents were maintained in the way in which they were originally received, but folders have been arranged in a more chronological order. Some notes are entirely handwritten, while logs and records consist of typed templates which have been filled-in by hand. Notes contain illustrations of birds and nests, graphs of bird activity during observance, and descriptions of bird behavior. Nesting logs have mostly been filled out by Mary Lois Garrett, but other authors contributed, including Twila Hessin, Ruth Geib, and an unspecified ornithology class.
