Background Information:

James E. Casto spent more than 40-years with *The Herald-Dispatch* as a reporter and editor. Due to his interests, many of the artifacts in his collection feature advertisements and local area business letterhead and logos. This collection features brochures, pamphlets, and local theater programs as a representation of the way advertisements developed over the span of 50-years. Additionally, items in this collection show early-Huntington and surrounding-area business letterhead.

Specific examples of artifacts in the "Advertisements" folder contain items such as "The Hippodrome Program", "The Parquet" via the Huntington Theater, and "Kieth-Albee News." Additionally, business letterhead includes Huntington-area businesses,

including: Elmons-Hawkins Hardware Co., Hotel Farr, the State Normal School, The Green & Green Co. Cracker Manufactory, Shelton, Blake, & Co., Bank of Huntington, and the Huntington Publishing Company. This collection also features an array of other publications either by or about the local Huntington, West Virginia, and surrounding communities.

Scope and Content:

This collection contains information of early Huntington, Charleston, Guyandotte, and surrounding area West Virginia businesses in the forms of advertisements, business letterhead, ink blotters, photographs, and publications. Items span from the mid-1880s to the mid-1980s.

Processing Notes:

Some items that were donated were moved to corresponding collections. Those items are indicated at the end of this finding aid.
