Dear Mr. Lambert:

Thank you for your letter of recent date. I shall be glad to undertake research on any of the families whom you indicate, but not on the basis which you stipulate, of paying a reasonable fee, "if you succeed".

I have been doing Georgia and South Carolina research too long not to know the pitfalls of that clause. I have worked in all the courthouses of all the older Georgia counties, and have also been employed at the Department of Archives in Atlanta and have access to some records there which the average searcher never sees. Because of this experience, I know how easy it is to "almost" complete a line.

My usual fee is \$2.00 per hour. I shall be glad to search for you on any of the families which you indidate for \$1.50 per hour spending as much or as little time as you desire. That is here in Atlanta.

If you need, as you probably do, work in the county courthouses I charge according to the time spent plus seven cents per mile for the use of my car.

If these terms are agreeable to you I shall be glad to serve you to the best of my ability.
