The William Weed Family

William Weed of Cuyoga County, New York was the grandfather of William A. Weed of Nine Mile Creek. The Weeds were plain Yankees, probably English. A Mr. Weed, who was from Massachusetts, and who was preparing a Weed genealogy, said they were English. Grandfather Weed lived with my parents from the time I can remember, until he died. I am a brother to William A. Weed. Our parents were Marcus Edna Weed and Elizabeth Mead, born in Gallia County, Ohio. We lived in Springfield Township, at Porter, now called Bidwell. Our grandfather Mead was Ebenezer Mead. He married Ann Collins born in Holland, hence Dutch. She died at her home on Nine Mile Creek, below the Phoenix factory. Marcus E. Weed and wife lived on the right hand side of the creek.

They had five sons and one daughter all dead.

I. Gilbert Weed, a soldier in the ^{Co. A.} 91st Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry. He enrolled at Gallipolis, O., and served two years, and four months. He was killed in the Battle of Winchester. Not married.

II. Allen Weed. Single. Killed accidentally while at home cutting timber, at 19, at home, in Gallia County, O. He was buried, in Cherrington Cemetery, near Evergreen, Ohio.
