Scope and Content:

Seven scrapbooks consisting of newspaper clippings, flyers, broadsides and posters related to crimes in the late 19th century. Materials are pasted into ledgers, both blank and written on. The ledger text is not legible in most cases. Other materials unrelated to crime such as postcards and notes are in the scrapbooks rarely.
