## The Kilgore

Thomas Kilgore was a son of Matthew and Mary Kilgore, who lived in Ross County, Ohio, County Seat - Chillicothe, O. Matthew was killed, in Ross Co., in 1823, by Indians. He was hunting. Mary Kilgore was probably born in Ireland. The Kilgores were Scotch, but fled to Ireland, at the time when wool was being heavily taxed. They came to the U. S. before the Revolution.

Matthew Kilgore had lived in York County, Pa., and sold his land to his son, John Kilgore, and his descendants own it yet.

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

See application of Elenora Love Glenn Helsell, of Fort Dodge Cpahter , Fort Dodge, Iowa, accepted by the National Society October 17, 1918, National No. 141112.

See also Application of my cousin, Susan Brandom Hope, accepted by the National Society December 6, 1923, National No. 194,426.

Charles Love served from May 25, 1776 to March 5, 1778 as a private soldier in Capt. Thomas Berry's Company , 8th Virginia Regiment, commanded by Col Bowman, of the Virginia Line. See "Virginia Pay Rolls, War Department 166, 1 thru 7", in Virginia State Library.

He was in the battles of Brandywine and Germantown , as appears by his Application for pension, dated June 15, 1818, which application was allowed. At the time of making this application he was 65 years of age, and resided in Pendleton County, Kentucky. See his application for pension , Survivor File No. 36046, Department of the Interior, Pension Bureau.

It appears, also, that he served as a Militiaman for 113 days in 1775, in a company under Lieutenant Sigemund Stribling, and was entitled to pay therefore in the sum of 8 pounds, 9 shillings and six pence. See "M.S.List Militiamen paid off at Romney". in "Romney 35", Virginia State Library.

He also served as a soldier of Infantry, Virginia Line, Continental Establishment , and was entitle by reason of this service,

to a balance of 16 pounds, and 8 shillings. See entry in  
"Warv4, Page , Page 251, Virginia State Library, under  
heading, "A List of the Solfiers in the Virginia Line on  
Continetal Establishment who have received Certificates for  
the balance of their full pay agreeable to an Act of Assembly  
passed November session, 1781".

At the time of his death in 1824, Charles Love resided  
in Cabbell County, Virginia, (now West Virginia). At the time  
of his marriage he reaided at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, He  
was a son of William Love, and brother of William Love, Jr. both  
of whom served as soldiers in the Westmòreland County, Pennsylv-  
vania Militia, Continental Line, Revolutionary War and receiv-  
ed Depreciation Pay for their services. (See Penn. Archives,  
5th Series, Vol. 4, Pages 445 and 776).

"Thomas C. Wallace deceased - was born in the eastern part of Virginia, a son of Benjamin and Emality Wallace, who were then residents in that section of the country. The date of his birth was September 16th, 1815, and his marriage took place February 4th, 1840, in Cabell County, West Virginia. In 1857 he settled in Mason County, purchasing a good farm in Arbuckle District, which at his death, February 28th, 1875, was left to his wife and her twelve living children. His wife was Elizabeth, daughter of Andrew and Mary (Chapman) Jordan, and her birth was in Cabell County, November 22nd, 1822. The children were born: Jonathan J., Nov. 6, 1841; John M., Aug. 13, 1843; Mary A., June 15th, 1845; Levanus G., Aug. 13, 1847; Elviria, March 15, 1849; Nincy C., Apr. 17, 1851; Samuel J., March 28, 1853; Charles C., Apr. 26th, 1855; Andrew L. Dec. 7, 1857; Elizabeth L., Sept. 15, 1864; Emily C. Feb. 5, 1867; Samuel J. died July 30, 1853; Levanus G. lives in Gallia Co., Ohio, and the other children all make their home in Mason County. Mrs. Wallace's father was born Jan. 12, 1785. Nov. 15, 1872 is the date of his death. Her mother was born Dec. 22nd, 1784, and died November 5, 1869. The post office address of Mrs. Wallace is Pliny Store, Putnam Count, W. Va."
