REV. JOHN JARRELL.

Rev. John Jarrell, born in Russell County, Virginia May 27th, 1806, was a son of Lazarus Damron and Jane Jarrell.

When twenty years of age he accompanied his parents to what is now Wayne County, where they made settlement at that early date, and were both prominent in the development of the county.

At the Forks of the Big Sandy river, in the State of Kentucky, December 14th, 1827, John Jarrell and Elizabeth Bromley were wedded. She was born at the Forks of Big Sandy November 25th, 1811, a daughter of William and Mary (Short) Bromley, both natives of Russell County, Virginia. She was about five years of age when her parents made their home in what is now Wayne county.

The children of Rev. and Mrs. Jarrell were born:

Jane, December 3rd, 1829; William, November 21st, 1831; Moses D., November 30, 1833; John and Samuel, February 2, 1836. Samuel was assassinated; Mary, December 9, 1838; Nancy, March 30, 1841; Rebecca, July 2nd, 1844; Elizabeth, December 25, 1846, died September 13th, 1876; Harrison, March 7th, 1849; Rachel, August 3rd, 1852; and James B. February 3rd, 1855.

Samuel was shot by a squad of soldiers belonging to Colonel Zigler's command, on the morning of the 19th day of October 1861 and died at 9 P.M. the same day. He had taken no part in the war, and had given no provocation to his murderers.

Nancy lived in Martin county, Kentucky, and the others in Wayne County.

The Rev. John Jarrell was a prominent minister of the Gospel in the Missionary Baptist church for the greater part of his life; pastor of Pleasant church 26 years in succession; Greenbrier church 4 years; Bethesda church 8 years; Fairview and Cassville, 12 years

Salem, 4 years; He has also ministered to various other churches especially, the Elizabeth Jarrell church, in Kentucky.

Fairview church was built up under the labors of Rev. John Jarrell and Rev. William T. Ball.

John Jarrell died November, 1884, leaving at the time of his death, eighty-four grand children,

end of the first bottom
below Harmon's Rockhouse"
then leaving said fork

(Above is the earliest
grant to any Copley.)
