Biographical Notes:

There are two Enos Amos' that lived in West Virginia in this time period that could be the one named in this certificate. One resided in Marion county, was an allopathic doctor, and lived from 1831-1888, while the other was a farmer in Wetzel county and lived from 1845-1921. It is more likely the former is the named Enos Amos in this certificate, but additional information was provided in the event of uncertainty.

Scope and Content:

This collection consists of an oath of allegiance for Enos Amos' election to the office of second lieutenant, 17th Regiment, 3d Brigade, 1st Division, West Virginia Militia, Marion County, West Virginia on August 22, 1864. It is also signed by John B. Crane, recorder.

Processing Notes:

This collection was already processed at the time the finding aid was created. No changes in folder content or name were made.
