Biographical Notes:

Herman Palmer Dean (May 6, 1897-January 1978) was born in Wayne County and educated at Oakview Academy, Bethany College, and Ohio State University, majoring in journalism. He served in the Navy during World War I. While he lived in West Virginia, he was actively involved in a variety of business and social activities. For his work, he was the president and treasurer of the Standard Printing and Publishing Company in Huntington, while for social endeavors he was a Mason, I.O.O.F., K.G.E., K. of P., Beta Theta Pi, West Virginia Publishers Association, National Editorial Association, Guyandotte Club, and the Huntington Guyan Country Club. In his work in publishing, Dean published the Wayne County News, and used his presses to print books about firearms. He travelled extensively throughout Europe, Russia, South America, Canada, and America, many of these trips hunting expeditions. He was a firearms collector, and donated his firearm collection, which can now be found at the Huntington Museum of Art. He was married to Mary Dorcas *Spragg* Dean (1904-1970).

Scope and Content:

This collection consists predominantly of slides and photographs taken on Herman P. Dean's travels and limited papers consisting of travel brochures, firearm and book catalogs, personal notes and ephemera, and correspondence related to Dean's book purchasing habits.

The photographs are the bulk of the collection and consist of 200-300 slides that were unable to examined extensively and more than 200 developed photographs from various trips and events. Several trips have been identified: one to the Hudson Bay area ("Rupert's Land Montreal" Trip Set, part 1 and part 2), one for the Rockies which is extensively captioned (Captioned Trip Shot Photos (Rockies)), three distinct fishing trips with unknown locations (Contact sheets and Trip Shots from Contact Sheet, Miniature Travel Photo Set, and Fishing Trip Set Photos). Also notable in the collection are photos from social events, including a banquet, a reception/unknown event, shooting excursions, a minstrel show, and costumed events. Also included are portraits of Dean in his office and another of Dean in his gallery in the Huntington Museum of Art.

Processing Notes:

This collection was partially processed at the time this finding aid was created. Folders in box two were only vaguely titled (i.e. "Pix" for photographs) and as such original order was assumed to be gone. Photographs were resorted into "groups" based on photos that were developed together. Where no groups existed, these materials were sorted by subject. Any folder title with the word (Mixed) in the title consists of multiple groups of photographs.
