Biographical Notes:

Mark Freeman was from Doddridge County, West Virginia and was a high school graduate in 1952. He was a member of the United States Navy, 4th Regiment, Company 73. He was attached to the U.S.S. Trathen and was noted as living in Salem, West Virginia.

Scope and Content:

This collection contains two scrapbooks and several loose photographs documenting Mark Freeman's personal life and time in the United States Navy in the 1950s. The green scrapbook is composed entirely of unidentified and unlabeled photographs of Freeman's navy service, mostly of photos taken from his ship. Other notable groups of photographs in the scrapbook include photographs of women and sights in Japan. The brown scrapbook is composed of family photographs (most labelled), photographs of Freeman in Spencer, West Virginia, in the 1960s working with the West Virginia Department of Employment Security, and additional photographs of Freeman's time in the Navy, including post cards. Loose photograph subject matter includes a Navy ship, a group photo of his high school and Navy graduating class, and photographs that fell out of the scrapbook.

This collection was already processed at the time the finding aid was created. No changes to folder titles, order, or content were made.
