Biographical Notes:

Virginia Talbott Quay graduated with a B.A. from Marshall College's Teachers College in August 1942 and worked as an elementary school teacher. She was a member of several lineage societies, including the U.S. Daughters of 1812 and the Daughters of American Colonists. She was married to Arthur H. Quay.

Scope and Content:

This collection consists of several formats and topics of materials related to the activities of Virginia Talbott Quay, including a scrapbook of newspaper clippings dating between 1930 and 1950 about social and cultural events as well as the activities of lineage societies, including the United Daughters of the Confederacy. Other materials relate to her work with several lineage societies, including the U.S. Daughters of 1812 and Daughters of American Colonists. Also included in the collection are World War II materials such as a paper soldier cap, a pledge to sell bonds, and newspaper clippings. Other portions of the collection include a photograph of her graduating from Marshall College, prayers written on scrap paper, and correspondence such as mailings from the American Merchant Marine Library Association.
