Biographical Notes:

Carlton D. "Buck" Weaver was born in Grantsville, West Virginia, in 1921. Graduating from The Citadel in 1939, he entered Marshall College (now Marshall University) in Huntington, West Virginia that same year. Following his service as a dive bomber pilot in WWII, Weaver returned to school at West Virginia University, graduating with a degree in Petroleum Engineering in 1948. He worked for Ashland Oil, Inc. for 30 years. His ancestors were among the first to move into the land that later became West Virginia, emigrating from Pennsylvania, after emigrating from Germany. He became fascinated with the land on which his ancestors lived and traveled. He had a love of maps and so began devoting his spare time to collecting maps of the Trans-Allegheny region. Weaver's collecting took him to map dealers throughout the United States, as well as London. He took great pride in his ancestors and the land they occupied as depicted in the early North American maps he collected. In 1992 he donated "The Carlton D. Weaver Trans-Allegheny Map Collection" to Marshall University.

Scope and Content:

This collection consists of 33 early American maps documenting the Trans-Allegheny region between 1631 and 1881 collected by Carlton D. Weaver. Sizes, formats, and printing processes vary greatly. Of particular note are maps featuring railroads and coal. Maps numbered 12 and 13 are high-quality reproductions; the others are original.

Processing Notes:

This collection was already processed at the time the finding aid was created. Minimal changes to folder titles, order, or content were made.

Notes: The copperplate that produced this map was originally prepared by Jodocus Hondius Jr. in 1618. It was published in 5 states, or versions, three with decorative borders and two without. This map, the third state with a decorative border, was published by Henricus Hondius in 1631. It is an appropriate representation of what was known about English North and South America during the first quarter of the Seventeenth Century. This map contains insets of Greenland and the South Pole. It depicts California as a peninsula and only shows one Great Lake.

Notes: The first permanent settlement in North America was at Jamestown on the James River, Virginia, in 1607. John Smith, one of the original settlers, explored the region and drew a map in 1612. This is an attractive example of Henricus Hondius' derivation of Smith's 1612 map. The map is based upon the 1618 map drawn by Henricus, the brother of Jodocus Hondius. This was one of the first maps engraved by Henricus for his *Atlantis Appendix* of 1630. Within the map also appears the British Royal Arms and vignettes depicting the interior of a native hut, entitled "Status Regius Powhatan," and a full figure of an Indian warrior.



Notes: Settler's fine map of eastern North America was copied from Henri Chatelain's *Carta del la Nouvelle France*, published in 1719. This example is typical of the high standard of German maps of this period. There is a decorative title cartouche, "apparently an allegorical representation of the wealth and happiness to be found in the New World." The map covers the area from what is now the Mexican border to Hudson Bay and eastern Canada. The coloring serves to emphasize the political divisions of the area shown with English colonies along the eastern seaboard, the French province of Canada, ou la Nouvella France, the English possessions around Hudson's Bay, the French province of La Louisiane La Florida. It is a "decorative, impressive and uncommon map."

Notes: This is one of the first maps to show the peninsula for California and the first printed map to name the Saragosa Sea. This map shows the then known areas of the North American continent. Note the large ornate cartouche which covers the Northwest. Also the West Indies are prominently noted, as is the Mississippi River. Many French and English strongholds and settlements are named.

Notes: Guillaume De L'Isle was an important French Cartographer. His earlier 1718 map was the first detailed map of the Gulf region and the Mississippi. This is the first printed map to show Texas as a name. The detail and accuracy of *Carta Geographical della Florida* is typical of the 18th century French school. De L'Isle gave significant impetus to the advancement of cartography as a science by his strict standards of inclusivity.

Notes: This is a small, but important map which influenced British perceptions of the Colonies until the Treaty of 1763. It shows 'Walker's Settlement 1750' on the Cumberland River. Emmanuel Bowen (ca. 1720-1767) was an engraver, print setter and publisher in London. He was appointed Engraver of Maps to both King George II of England and Louis XV of France. It was initially published in the *London Magazine* in 1749.



It is the first map to show upper Ohio Valley topography.



Notes: This is a large detailed map of North America from Newfoundland to the Gulf of Mexico, and west to the Missouri River. It is the earliest and best large scale survey of American and British colonies, and described by the authority, Colonel Martin of the library of Congress, as "Without serious doubt... the most important map in American history." It was the only comprehensive map of the theater of war during the American Revolution and was the authoritative cartographical document referred to during the negotiations of peace in Paris in 1782 and 1783. Mitchell's map was hung in the Halls of Congress in 1802. It was used for the purpose of determining land grants in the Ohio and Mississippi Valleys; received official status in the September 29, 1782, convention between the United States and Great Britain.


Notes: The late eighteenth century mapping of Virginia was dominated by Joshua Fry and Peter Jefferson's *A Map of the Inhabited Part of Virginia Containing the Whole Province of Maryland*, 1751. Not for another forty years was another map maker to improve upon their work. Consequently the Fry and Jefferson map formed an important source for subsequent map-makers, as well as a number of direct derivatives, such as this map by the French map publishers the Vaugondy's, published in 1755 and issued in the *Atlas Universal*. The rarity of the early Fry and Jefferson map made this the earliest obtainable map to accurately depict the interior of Virginia beyond the Tidewater.

It held official status in that it was ordered by the London Board of Trade. One of the four top pre-Revolution maps of Virginia. First edition published in 1755.

Notes: This map covers the thirteen United States, Louisiana, and parts of Canada, Florida, and Mexico. It shows the boundaries, towns and Cities, forts, Indian villages and tribal territory, mines, grasslands and relief, as well as a few historical notes. Thomas Bowen's distinguished father was the official engraver for King George II. He engraved for his father's atlas, *British American Plantations* and Captain Cook's *Royal English Atlas*, 1767; along with several other atlases.

Notes: Lattre dedicated this map to “His Excellency Mr. Benjamin Franklin,” who was the principal negotiator of the Peace Treaty which settled the boundaries of American Independence. This was the first French map of the newly created United States of America. Lattre borrowed generously from previously published maps and he seems especially to have favored John Mitchell’s *1775 Map of British and French Dominions of North America*. This map is one of the most attractively designed and executed maps of the period and reflects the talent and skill of the artist-cartographer.



Notes: This map shows the reduced boundaries of Virginia. Once its boundaries stretched west from the Chesapeake Bay to the Mississippi River, north up the Mississippi River to the Canadian line and southeast along the Great Lakes to Pennsylvania. This map reflects the January 2, 1781, Virginia General Assembly decision to cede to the Federal Government all its claims to the land northwest of the Ohio River. Further changes came in 1792, when Virginia counties south of the Ohio River and West of the Big Sandy became the Commonwealth of Kentucky. This is a high quality reproduction that adds depth to the collection.




















