Marshall Health, Marshall University, Mountain Health Network boards approve new name for integrated academic health system

AUGUST 29, 2023

The Marshall Health, Marshall University and Mountain Health Network governing boards earlier this month voted unanimously to approve a single name for the newly integrated academic health system — Marshall Health Network, Inc.

Leaders from the three organizations will discuss the integration and evolution of the new health system during the West Virginia Chamber Business Summit this week in White Sulphur Springs.

The integrated academic health system will consist of Mountain Health Network's four hospitals: Cabell Huntington Hospital, St. Mary's Medical Center, Hoops Family Children's Hospital and Rivers Health; its ambulatory facilities, medical offices and employed physician practices; and Marshall Health's physician practice and its facilities.

The adoption of the Marshall brand allows for the next step in realizing the vision of an integrated academic health system. Marshall Health Network best reflects the shared purpose of the three entities, while also unifying their identities and reaffirming their strength as a collective, harnessing the full potential of their focus on education, clinical care and research.

The three entities are continuing their due diligence and are working toward a definitive agreement by Oct. 1. A staff and community event will be held later this fall to celebrate the agreement's completion.

Deadline for honors seminar proposals for Spring 2024 is Tuesday Sept. 5

What is a course that you dream of doing? The Honors College provides faculty of programs from across the university the opportunity to design and teach Honors Seminars on subjects that inspire them, but that they may not have the opportunity to teach within their regular teaching duties. Faculty in our small sections of HON 480 work with outstanding, highly-motivated students to actively explore a subject together from an interdisciplinary approach. The college serves the entire university with majors in all programs. The Honors College provides a space where people from all over the university come together to share ideas. We are an academic crossroads where collaboration is foundational.

The Honors College new seminar proposal and repeat seminar application deadline is Tuesday 05 September 2023. Proposals for **new** upper-level, interdisciplinary honors seminars to be taught as early as Spring 2024 can be submitted online through a form found on the Teaching Honors page of the Honors College website at <u>https://www.marshall.edu/honors/teaching/</u>. Full details and helpful information for preparing proposals are available there. Accepted proposals are scheduled as special topic sections of HON 480, which serves as a core upper-division course in the required Honors Curriculum for students in the college. Seminar proposals undergo review by the Honors College Curriculum and Policy Committee at least one semester prior to the semester in which an approved seminar will be offered. For faculty who have previously taught sections of HON 480, a shorter **repeat** (or updated) application is also due on that date. **Please note that all Student Credit Hours (SCH) for faculty teaching HON courses will be credited to their home department**. If you are interested in teaching for the Honors College, but not sure if you are ready to submit a proposal for review next semester, please reach out to discuss your ideas with us at <u>honorscollege@marshall.edu</u>. 

The Marshall University Joan C. Edwards School of Medicine's Standing Out In Our Field fundraiser takes place on Saturday, August 26, 2023, at the Barboursville Soccer Complex.



The Marshall University Joan C. Edwards School of Medicine's Standing Out in Our Field (SOIOF) 8 raised more than \$100,000 for its student scholarship endowment. The annual event was held Saturday, Aug. 26, at the Barboursville Soccer Complex.

"It's always wonderful to see the community come out to support our future physicians," said Linda S. Holmes, director of development and alumni affairs at the School of Medicine. "Since our inaugural SOIOF event in 2014, we've invested nearly \$900,000 into an endowment fund that provides medical student scholarships."

More than 500 guests enjoyed the "Margaritaville"-themed fundraising event and outdoor dining experience featuring music by Santa Cruz, dancing and a gourmet Caribbean menu by Cabell Huntington Hospital's Executive Chef Don Sallada. The event's title sponsor was Mountain Health Network, the school's major teaching hospital partner. Seventy medical students and future medical students from the B.S./M.D. and M.D. Early Assurance programs were volunteer servers.



"It was a privilege to volunteer at this event," said Jentre Hyde, a fourth-year medical student from Parkersburg, West Virginia. "Scholarships are vital to decreasing student debt." Nomination guidelines:

Faculty, staff and administration may nominate a faculty member for the following awards:

- Hedrick Outstanding Faculty Award
- Reynolds Outstanding Teacher Award
- Pickens-Queen Teacher Award

Students may nominate a faculty member for the following awards:

- Reynolds Outstanding Teacher Award
- Pickens-Queen Teacher Award

ONLY **members of the Council of Chairs** may nominate a faculty member for the Council of Chairs Award.

Brief descriptions of each award are provided below. For additional information, click on the award name.

Hedrick Outstanding Faculty Award

The \$5,000 award is the most prestigious form of faculty recognition at Marshall University.

Eligible Nominees

- must be in a full-time, tenured appointment in a unit that reports to Academic Affairs;
- must have a minimum of seven years of full-time teaching experience at Marshall University (*a person is first eligible for nomination in the fall of the 8th year*);
- must have a record of outstanding scholarship, research and/or creative activity plus outstanding undergraduate or graduate teaching.

Marshall & Shirley Reynolds Outstanding Teacher Award

The \$3000 award is presented to a faculty member who demonstrates superior teaching.

Eligible Nominees

- must be in a full-time tenured appointment in a unit that reports to Academic Affairs;
- must have a minimum of six years of credited full-time teaching experience, at least three of which are at Marshall. (For the purposes of this award, "credited full-time teaching experience" refers to the total years of experience that Academic Affairs counts as part of a faculty member's tenured or tenure-track appointment at Marshall University.)

Pickens-Queen Teacher Award

The \$1000 award provides encouragement and incentive for teaching achievement by newer faculty members and is presented to three junior faculty members.

Eligible Nominees

- must be in a full-time tenure-track appointment in a unit that reports to Academic Affairs;
- must have at least one year full-time, tenure-track teaching experience at Marshall and no more than five years of credited full-time teaching experience. (For the purposes of this award, "credited full-time teaching experience" refers to the total years of experience that Academic Affairs counts as part of a faculty member's tenured or tenure-track appointment at Marshall University.)

Council of Chairs Award for Excellence in Teaching

The \$1000 award has been established to recognize teaching excellence in Marshall University's full-time term and temporary faculty. Nominations for this award must be submitted by department chairs or the Council of Chairs. Each fall, members of the Council of

Chairs (excepting the School of Medicine) will be permitted to nominate up to two candidates from a given department.

Eligible Nominees:


- must be in a full-time *term* or full-time *temporary* faculty appointment;
- must have at least two years' full-time teaching at Marshall University. A person is first eligible for nomination in the fall of the 3rd year of teaching.

Festival offers \$10,000 in prizes to makers of all ages

To celebrate the 10th anniversary of the West Virginia Makes Festival, the Marshall Advanced Manufacturing Center (MAMC) is offering \$10,000 in cash prizes to winners of this year's Design Challenge.

Artisans, inventors, manufacturers, students and makers of all kinds are encouraged to enter their creations by participating in the Oct. 6

festival on the Huntington campus of Marshall University, said Kara Mullins, Makes Festival coordinator.

"We want to make this year's festival the biggest and best yet," Mullins said. "To encourage more participation from across West Virginia and beyond, we're offering the largest prize cache ever. People of all ages are eligible to compete for a share of the money."

Multiple prizes will be awarded in adult and youth categories, including a \$5,000 cash award to the adult champion, \$1,000 to the youth champion and \$500 to the People's Choice winner, as voted on by festivalgoers.


"This is a celebration of creativity and ingenuity in all forms," Mullins said. "That why we encourage makers of all ages, from elementary school-age children to retired adults to demonstrate their creations, whatever they are."

This year, West Virginia's largest maker fair coincides with National Manufacturing Day. Mullins urged manufacturers of all types to participate in the festival to represent the state's rich history of manufacturing.

"There are a variety of ways to participate in the Makes Festival," Mullins explained. "In addition to the Design Challenge, individuals can demonstrate their creations, register as exhibitors and offer information about how they support makers, provide making activities or games, or attend as a school or other group. We want everyone who can come to join us and enjoy all the festival has to offer, from hands-on making activities, virtual reality and robotics to music and even a *splat-tacular* pumpkin drop presented by the June Harless Center at Marshall University!"

There is no cost to participate in the festival but Design Challengers, exhibitors and groups are asked to register at <u>www.mfg.marshall.edu/wvmf2023</u>. Design challengers and other makers are welcome to sell their creations during the event.
