WVU, Marshall launch program to keep young professionals in the Mountain State

SEPTEMBER 6, 2023



[First Ascent](#), a new program designed to cultivate and retain local talent within West Virginia, is now accepting applications from recent [West Virginia University](#) and [Marshall University](#) graduates, helping West Virginia's best and brightest young professionals stay close to home.

Built on the foundation of the [Brad and Alys Smith Outdoor Economic Development Collaborative](#) and the state Department of Tourism's

successful [Ascend WV](#) program, First Ascent is designed to set participants on paths for successful remote and hybrid careers in the state, addressing the population loss and brain drain that stems from new graduates pursuing employment opportunities elsewhere.

“For too long, we have watched as the young people our state needs for its future have packed up and left,” WVU [President Gordon Gee](#) said. “The love our graduates have developed for West Virginia while living and learning here during their collegiate careers is profound. This kind of post-graduation support can help them forge pathways to stay while embarking on challenging, fulfilling careers.”

Six communities — including five existing Ascend locations— will be home to First Ascent members: Morgantown Area, Huntington Area, Eastern Panhandle, New River Gorge, Greater Elkins and Greenbrier Valley.

“When we started with Ascend, the goal was to bring people to West Virginia — either for the first time or as returners,” [Marshall University President Brad D. Smith](#) said. “With First Ascent, we’re working to keep our graduates in state by positioning West Virginia as a hub for remote workers who can find success in the increasingly digital world while supporting overall state economic growth.”

Current students and alumni from WVU and Marshall can apply for First Ascent during the last year of their degree program through one-year post-graduation. Those applying must be willing to live in a [featured community](#) and accept a remote or hybrid full-time position for a company based inside or outside of West Virginia, or have launched a business that operates and/or delivers services remotely prior to applying.

Those who qualify for First Ascent will have access to free co-working space and outdoor recreation equipment, success coaches and professional mentorships, a remote worker certification, professional development, community engagement, outdoor and social activities, and more.

Supporting entities include [WVU Career Services](#), the [John Chambers College of Business and Economics Center for Career Development](#) and the [Marshall Office of Career Education](#).

First Ascent solidifies the program’s impact on the future of the state’s workforce and demonstrates a commitment to investing in the future of West Virginians. Seed funding for the First Ascent pilot program originated from [WVU Provost Maryanne Reed’s Innovation Summit](#). A subsequent award was provided by the U.S. Economic Development Administration’s [Build Back Better Regional Challenge Grant](#) to Coalfield Development and WVU, and will fund the First Ascent program. A \$25 million gift from the Wing 2 Wing Foundation was awarded to WVU to launch the Ascend WV program in partnership with the state. This funding provided the foundation for the Brad and Alys Smith Outdoor Economic Development Collaborative to leverage West Virginia’s outdoor assets, take a lead role in asset-based economic development by investing in people and communities, and build the infrastructure that will ultimately serve as a model for workforce development.



“West Virginia’s greatest assets are her people, her culture and her vast natural resources,” Smith said. “First Ascent capitalizes on these assets by providing an important pathway for our state’s graduates to build a successful and viable career here in the Mountain State. I am confident the First Ascent program will strengthen the state’s efforts to enlist our best and brightest to remain in the state and build the foundation for a more prosperous future for all West Virginians.”

Smith and Gee announced the program's launch during the West Virginia Chamber of Commerce's Annual Meeting and Business Summit at The Greenbrier Resort on Aug. 30.

"First Ascent will help build a workforce that can be used to attract employers from a variety of industries," Gee said. "All of West Virginia stands to benefit from this investment in talented, motivated young professionals and from having them in communities that offer quality-of-life benefits not available anywhere else."

Marshall launches new tutoring partnership with Knack

Marshall University has announced a new academic partnership with Knack — a leading peer tutoring platform enabling our students to learn from one another.

Knack's platform allows students to book one-on-one and group tutoring sessions. Knack Tutors are verified high-achieving students from Marshall who have previously aced the courses they offer assistance in. Tutoring is subsidized for all students and sessions can take place in-

person or online.

For a successful launch of this program, we need assistance from faculty and staff across campus. Two ways you can help us introduce Knack to students:

1. **Share Information:** Include Knack in your student or class resources. Below is a short explanation you can copy and paste to share with your students.

Students looking for additional assistance outside of the classroom are advised to consider working with a peer tutor through Knack. Marshall has partnered with Knack to provide students with access to verified peer tutors who have previously aced this course. 1. **Recommend Tutors:** We are continually recruiting best-fit students (perhaps your high-achievers) to sign up and list themselves as peer tutors on the platform. Please recommend students who've received a B or better to tutor by completing the brief [Knack Tutor Professor Recommendation Form](#), which allows you to recommend one or more students in just a few minutes. Upon receiving, Knack will help interested students create a Knack Tutor Account and begin tutoring.

\$3 million grant awarded to combat opioid crisis in rural West Virginia communities

The Marshall University Center of Excellence for Recovery, in collaboration with Westbrook Health Services, has received a \$3 million grant from the Health Resources and Services Administration's (HRSA) Rural Communities Opioid Response Program. This grant aims to address the pressing issue of opioid use in rural West Virginia by expanding access to Medications for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) and support services.

Amy Saunders is the managing director for the Center of Excellence for Recovery.

"We are excited about this collaboration with Westbrook Health Services," Saunders said. "This project will allow us to help reach people with substance use disorders where they are. This project will establish new access points for essential care in underserved rural communities, where access and services are limited."

President and CEO of Westbrook Health Services Kevin Trippett says Westbrook is happy to be a part of the collaborative effort.

"Westbrook is extremely excited about this opportunity," Trippett, said. "With this grant, we will be able to purchase our second mobile MAT unit, a mobile vehicle with private space for patients to connect with a medical professional via tele health for management of medications for individuals with substance use disorder. This will bring services to those in need who might otherwise not have access to reliable care for them to reach the path to recovery."

By combining the expertise of Westbrook Health Services, an experienced local behavioral health center, and the Marshall University Center of Excellence for Recovery, this collaboration will offer MOUD access and support in the heart of the communities that need it most. Together, their efforts hold the potential to create a substantial positive impact on the lives of numerous individuals in West Virginia and stand as a model for pioneering approaches to address the rural opioid crisis.



Baker named Structured Literacy Dyslexia Specialist

Communication Disorders faculty member Jennifer Baker was recently certified as a Structured Literacy Dyslexia Specialist.

The certification is provided by the Center for Effective Reading Instruction, which is an affiliate of the International Dyslexia Association. The certification process included coursework, a supervised clinical practicum, and a comprehensive exam.

Baker is an assistant professor and a speech-language pathologist in the Marshall Speech and Hearing Center. She has spent much of her career working with children with language disorders, including those who have difficulty learning to read.

“There is a significant need for science-based intervention for struggling readers, especially those with dyslexia,” Baker said. “Every child deserves to learn to read, even when there are obstacles. I’m thankful for this opportunity to expand my knowledge and skills so that we can better serve our clients and ensure that our clinical students leave Marshall with a better understanding of dyslexia and the evidence-based interventions that can help.”

The Center for Effective Reading Instruction is dedicated to improving education by strengthening the knowledge of teachers. Its mission is to further evidence-based approaches to reading so that all students can acquire the highest levels of literacy and thrive. The center works with all levels of teachers and dyslexia specialists focused on providing students with the best help to learn to read effectively. The main goal is simple: to improve the quality of reading instruction for those around us.

Pam Holland is the chair of the Department of Communication Disorders.

“Professor Baker is a valuable member of our faculty and an excellent resource for families in the Tri-State area,” Holland said.

In the past, Baker has offered Tiny Talkers and ReadingU, both summer programs that utilized books and reading to support speech and language development. She was also the recipient this summer of a grant by the West Virginia Department of Education called “Leading the Way for Literacy: Education and Skill Development for Practicing Speech Language Pathologists,” and will be creating and offering professional development courses for speech-language pathologists.

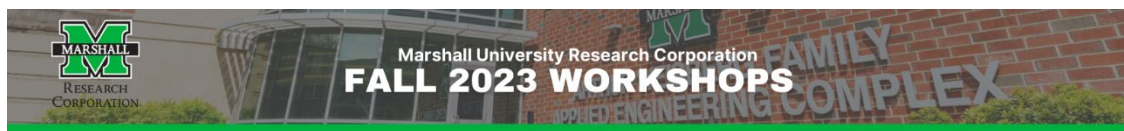

Beeson joins Marshall as chair of counseling

Dr. Eric T. Beeson, a leader in the field of counselor education and nationally recognized trailblazer for his innovative work in neuroscience integration in counseling, has been named the chair of the counseling department in Marshall's College of Education and Professional Development. His selection is the culmination of a six-month national search.

Dr. Teresa Eagle, dean of the college, said she is grateful for the search committee's diligent work through the extensive process. "The selection of Dr. Beeson brings a proven leader in the field of counseling to our campuses," Eagle said. "Dr. Beeson's appointment comes at a crucial time in the development of the counseling program and

the reorganization of the college."

After completing his doctoral degree from Ohio University, Beeson gained extensive experience in academic innovation, digital education, accreditation and curriculum development. He comes

to Marshall from Northwestern University, where he served as clinical full professor, and director of teaching and learning innovation. He was also the 43rd president of the American Mental Health Counselors Association and founding co-associate editor of the first-ever section in the Journal of Mental Health Counseling dedicated to neuroscience publications.

Beeson has authored over 20 peer-reviewed professional publications, a book on neuroeducation, several book chapters and numerous invited, national/international presentations on his work.

Beeson officially joined Marshall University Aug. 14 for the Fall 2023 semester and says he is ready to cultivate a shared vision for the counseling program and Marshall University. “I am stoked to join a robust program with a rich history. I believe we are poised to do something really special for the citizens of West Virginia and beyond.”




