SUBJECT: John Marshall Scholars

In an effort to expand the Honors Program and to enhance the academic experience of the John Marshall Scholars, we would like to initiate the process of establishing a small number of required Honors courses for John Marshall Scholars. There is ample precedent for special course requirements for scholarship students such as the 4 seminar program of Yeager Scholars here and the multi-course requirement of Brock Scholars at the University of Tennessee. We propose that John Marshall Scholars participate in an academic program consisting of an 8 week introductory freshman honors course (1 hr.), a freshman/sophomore interdisciplinary seminar of their choice (4 hrs.), and an upperclass interdisciplinary seminar of their choice (4 hrs.).

UH 150: Critical Issues (4 hrs.)  
UH 195: Science and the Arts (4 hrs.)  
UH 196: The American Experience (4 hrs.)  
UH 197: Ideas in Social Science (4 hrs.)  
  
UH 395: Interdisciplinary Honors (4 hrs.)  
UH 396: Interdisciplinary Honors (4 hrs.)
