#### GENERAL MEETING

Thursday, November 10, 8 P. M. Junior League Community Center

The subject will relate to our local Program, but to a Continuing Responsibility rather than to either Current Agenda item. Mayor David Francis has consented to answer questions for us on the achievements of Council-Manager Government. His answers will be based largely on the series of six speeches which he has given recently to various service clubs of Huntington, each dealing with a different department.

As we all know, a city election is due in 1961, primary in April, general in June. A new City Council is to be elected. Technically, there is no legal question involved as to whether Council-Manager government is to be retained or discarded, in spite of the fact that recently certain comments have been made which tend to give that impression.

Apparently there are certain elements which still yearn for the old Mayor-Council form of city government. Since the League has continually supported Council-Manager government, it is part of our responsibility to keep informed on what the last four years have meant to Huntington in terms of improved administration. Obviously, not all objectives have been reached in such a short time. However, we as League Members should be prepared to answer certain criticism which may be made from time to time.
